
Dr. Dawn Tirado Hamby is the Director of the Office of Apprenticeship for the State of Arkansas, with over 28 years of experience in education, training and management. A native of New York, her family is originally from Puerto Rico and moved to Arkansas in 1979. A graduate of Hendrix College, she earned a Bachelor's of Arts Degree in Psychology, followed by a Master's Degree in Secondary Education, and a Doctorate in Higher Education, with a specialty in Secondary Education Teaching and Administration.

For over a decade, Dr. Hamby served as the Director of Vocational Training for the Arkansas Career Training Institute (ACTI), which at the time, was 1 of only 8 Comprehensive Rehabilitation Centers in the country. Dr. Hamby is also experienced at public speaking, professional development, conducting workshops/seminars, and has served as a Governorappointee to numerous educational state boards and commissions, including the Arkansas Closing the Academic Achievement Gap Commission, for which she was unanimously elected chairman.

As Director of the Office of Apprenticeship, which is part of the Office of Skills Development (OSD), and a division of the Department of Commerce, Today, Dr. Hamby oversees/monitors over 100 apprenticeship schools throughout the state, and is responsible for the disbursement of state funding to those programs, in addition to coordinating the efforts between the United States Department of Labor (USDOL) and OSD. Part of her mission is to continue to partner with business and industry, apprenticeship schools, and 2-year colleges/universities, as a means of expand apprenticeship opportunities across the state.

Dr. Hamby is also a proud Military Mom – stationed in Japan, her daughter Savannah Ann, is an Air Force Armament Mechanic for the F-16 Fighter jet. Dr. Hamby currently resides in Little Rock, Arkansas with her husband Mark and their "furry children" MJ and Roxie. Rocky Mantooth

Rocky Mantooth is a Program Advisor for the Arkansas Office of Apprenticeship, which is part of the Office of Skills Development (OSD), and a division of the Department of Commerce. Mantooth monitors apprenticeship programs and schools across several disciplines, including Plumbing, Carpentry, Sheet Metal, HVAC, Painting, Iron Work, Pipefitting, Future Fuel, and Information Technologies. He also runs the State Plumbing Apprenticeship Committee (SPAC). SPAC works with plumbing apprenticeship schools statewide to provide outreach education, experience credit for new students, and advocate for apprentices navigating state licensure.

Mantooth himself completed a plumbing apprenticeship and obtained his Journeyman Plumbing License in 1984 while working for the Mantooth Plumbing Company. He later managed Circle M Plumbing for over fifteen years. Mantooth holds a Bachelor of Business Administration degree from Ouachita Baptist University. He completed the apprenticeship program with the Professional Golfers Association to obtain the distinction of Class A-1 PGA Professional in March of 1996.

Mantooth designed and built Hickory Creek Golf Course in Jacksonville, Arkansas, which he has owned since 1999.Mantooth resides in Sherwood Arkansas with his wife of thirty-nine years, Pam Mantooth, and their guard dog, a ferocious seven-pound Maltese, named Antoinette. 


Faculty/Employer/Career Services Professionals Panel
