Joe Rollins is the workforce development director of the Northwest Arkansas Council where he serves as a liaison between students, educators and business leaders to develop and strengthen the region's education programs so that students get needed training for area jobs and employers have a skilled workforce.

Rollins graduated with a business education degree in 2004, earning a master's in educational administration in 2006 and a doctorate in 2018, all from the University of Arkansas. He holds an educational specialist degree from Harding University.

Rollins comes from a long line of educators and started out teaching business in Springdale schools in 2004, then became Springdale High School's assistant principal in 2010. In 2015, he became founding principal of Don Tyson School of Innovation. In 2018, Rollins joined the Northwest Arkansas Council with a motivation to help graduates earn jobs using skills they're taught in school. To bridge the gap between students and employers, Rollins focuses on pipeline development strategies, facilitating apprenticeships, internships and career training programs, and invites employers to join the design process.


